Manager's Update - July 6, 2023

Ore Peninsula Redevelopment Project: One bid was received for this project from Pacific Pile & Marine (PPM) for a total of \$102,255,589 (this includes the base bid, force accounts, and Marine Services Platform (MSP) additive alternate — see bid tabulation online HERE). Our engineer's estimate for the total project cost, including the MSP and force accounts, is \$52,641,029. We met with PPM on July 5 to discuss their detailed bid schedule, and I am traveling to Seattle to meet with PPM and our engineers in person on July 6 to discuss descoping the project. This likely will involve focusing on the cruise float and postponing the other aspects of the project until a later time. I hope to have a recommendation for the Assembly at its July 20 meeting.

Waterfront Ambassadors & Visitor Statistics: The five municipal Waterfront Ambassadors were very busy in June, with 11,647 visitors assisted. They continue to make beneficial recommendations for improving visitor experience in the port. Thank you to Tourism Director Jaime Bricker for managing this valuable port service. Following are visitor statistics for the season so far:
