

## Manager's Update – November 2, 2023

**Clinic Interim Executive Director's Update:** The clinic has had three consultants this week on site and two federal representatives able to remote in for our triennial HRSA Operational Site Visit. ### **Port Director's Update:**

**2023 Visitor Statistics:** We wrapped up the 2023 summer cruise season on Wednesday, October 25. Over the course of the season, we saw 497 port calls with a total of 1,192,662 passengers. A record number of cruise passengers for Skagway.

**Ore Peninsula Redevelopment Project:** Temporary fuel header is installed and operational. The first fuel barge offloaded to the temporary fuel header on Saturday, October 28. The ore loader superstructure was taken down last week and work continues on the concrete cap. Template pile work at the ore loader cap, and dolphins 3 and 4 will begin late this week.

**Yukon Geoscience Forum:** We will be attending this regional conference in Whitehorse, November 19-22. We will also be presenting an Ore Peninsula Redevelopment project update.

**Harbormaster's Update:** Hamilton has started the launch ramp extension project. The last float has been removed in order to reconstruct the end for a new hinge. Excavation and disposal has been completed, as well as placing the Grade 1 Armor Rock at the toe of the existing ramp. In the next couple of days the Grade A Rock and sleepers will be placed once a uniform grade is established. After the sleepers are placed the concrete planks will be installed. Class 2 rock will be placed at the end of the ramp on the next lower tides on November 13th.
