WHEREAS, The State of Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) Division of Water is accepting FY17 matching grant questionnaires through July 15, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the municipal matching grant program covers 85% of the project cost, with the Municipality matching 15% of the project cost; and

WHEREAS, funding is needed for the cost of expanding water service across the Pat Moore Memorial Bridge in Skagway; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of the water expansion project is \$996,870; and

WHEREAS, the desired municipal matching grant is in the amount of \$847,339, with a local match of \$149,530;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Assembly of the Municipality of Skagway that staff is authorized to apply on behalf of the Municipality of Skagway for a State of Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation Division of Water FY17 Municipal Matching Grant in the amount of \$847,339, to fund the expansion of water service over the Pat Moore Memorial Bridge; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Municipality of Skagway commits to providing \$149,530 as local matching funds for this grant; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the grant application is approved by ADEC, the borough manager is authorized to execute any and all documents that may be required by ADEC.


